Wellington Source Water Protection is looking for a motivated and technically curious Software Developer Co-op Student to join our team for a 4-month work term. You will support the development and maintenance of internal web applications used for Source Water Protection Management. This is a hands-on opportunity to gain real-world experience working with modern technologies.

Wellington Source Water Protection is a municipal partnership between the Townships of Centre Wellington, Guelph/Eramosa, Mapleton, Puslinch, Wellington North, the Towns of Erin and Minto and the County of Wellington. The purpose of the partnership is to implement the Clean Water Act and related source water protection requirements. The Clean Water Act's objective is to protect current and future sources of municipal drinking water.

This position reports to the Risk Management Official for Wellington Source Water Protection and will assist staff in implementing the source protection program in Wellington County.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist in developing, testing, and maintaining web applications using ASP.NET Core and JavaScript.
- Write and maintain SQL queries for Microsoft SQL Server and PostgreSQL databases.
- Participate in system debugging, code reviews, and version control using Git.
- Support the integration of new features and improvements into existing systems.
- Enter, manage, and analyze property-based data, including environmental and spatial datasets.
- Entering property specific site visit, inspection and review data and documents into Wellington Source Water Protection's application.
- Document technical tasks and workflows for internal use.
- Other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications and Requirements

- Currently enrolled in a Canadian University or College level computer programming, computer science, software engineering, software development program. Applicants must have completed second year of their studies.
- Coursework or project experience with web development, databases, and object-oriented programming
- Strong familiarity with: dotnet core, jquery / javascript, MS SQL Server and Postgres / Postgis.
- Ability to interact professionally with the public and colleagues.
- Ability to work independently and integrate with remote or hybrid team members.

- Proficient in use of Word, Excel, databases, Powerpoint.
- Coursework or project experience with web development, databases, and object-oriented programming.
- Strong problem-solving skills and willingness to learn.
- Strong communication and teamwork abilities.
